- To learn about, and engage in, spiritual habits and practices that facilitate spiritual growth
- To grow in balancing prayer, study and service and in developing practical wisdom based on Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience
- To gain experience and skills in providing individual and group spiritual direction in a Christ-centered program and context
- To participate in a creative partnership among Christian spiritual directors in Utah and/or neighbor States

Costs:

Pricing for this two-year program at the Episcopal Church Center of Utah is \$3,975. In the first year, the \$2,250 tuition covers 12 days of instruction and practicum at the ECCU, refreshment/snacks and some meals [one dinner and two lunches], resources of two Faculty and 1-2 Interns, administrative costs, reprints and other materials. In the second year the \$1,725 tuition covers 6 days of instruction and practicum at the ECCU, refreshment/snacks and some meals [one dinner and two lunches], Faculty and Intern resources, administrative costs, reprints and other materials, and supervision in monthly group meetings for ongoing evaluation and training. Not included are costs for transportation, overnight accommodation [available at low cost at the ECCU for those from out of town], other meals, and fees, if any, for individual spiritual direction and monthly personal quiet days. A \$50 processing fee is due with application and a non-refundable deposit of \$250 is due at time of admission to the program [to reserve a place—space is limited] and remaining tuition for the Program is due in advance on a quarterly basis, or by arrangement.

Entry Requirements

Admission is open to individuals [lay or clergy], from any Christian denomination or group, who have a bachelor's degree or its equivalent and/or have training or demonstrable knowledge of Scripture and theology. Life experience is highly valued as is awareness of a potential call to be a spiritual director. Admission to the program is granted when the following steps have been completed:

- A completed application submitted by December 1, 2014, or later if there are still openings. Early
 application is encouraged because the size of a class is limited to twelve students and thus may be closed
 before the deadline.
- A \$50 application fee, made out to CFDM-Utah
- A statement detailing educational background, work experience, Christian journey, involvement in church and Christian service, and interest in the program and in being a spiritual director [see attached questions].
- Two letters of reference [one pastoral and one personal]
- An interview with one of the Program Faculty/Staff

- 7. Besides the goal of becoming a spiritual director, what is going on internally within you that is leading you to seek out spiritual formation and direction training?
- 8. If you are married, describe your spouse's response to your desire to be in this program.
- 9. Describe your spiritual journey and your relationship with God at this time.
- 10. What do you see as your strengths? Weaknesses?
